




Q.2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes 335 responses




Q.3. How well were the teachers able to communicate? 335 responses




Q.4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 335 responses




Q.6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 335 responses




Q.7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.




Q.8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.




Q.9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 335 responses




Q.10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and Programme outcomes.






Q.12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 335 responses




Q.13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.










Q.17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 335 responses








Q.19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
