




















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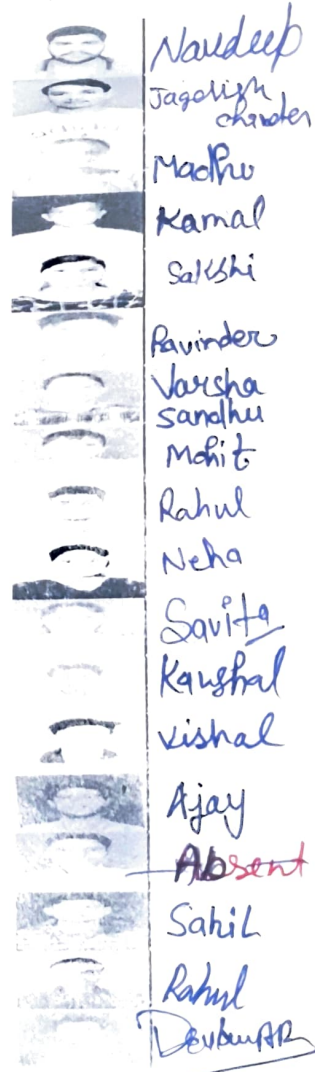

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INTRODUCTION

Socio-economic survey is a very development activity. In socio-economic survey we record demographic details, such as household caste wise, population report, education status, land holding and livestock of the village. Annual income and expenditure of families in the village information is collected and analysis the changes that take place in the entire village as well as in each individual.

IMPORTANCE OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC SURVEY

Socio-economic survey is very important as we come to know that actual conditions of area. What kind of people lives in this area? It tells us about the social conditions of the people in any area. What type of family, how the family survives. It also tells about their education attainment and self dependency.

What types of crops are growing by them? It helps us to know about their cropping pattern and stock rearing tendency. What type of technology they use.

Socio-economic data provides us actual situation of that area. Being surveyed we can analysis that type of improvement can be implied there. We can think about the reforms of that area.

USE OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC SURVEY

We know that what kind of activities coming out by the people. Like – primary, secondary and tertiary etc.

It tells us about the real economic situation of the people. How many people face the problem of poverty in any particular area?

It tells us about the dependency and independence of population from total population. It gives us the real information of human resources.

It likes annual income of family, per person income. It tells us that how many use vehicles and what types of vehicles they use. It tells that what type of technology they use in cropping pattern is found in that area.

Socio-Economic data of area helps government to know about that kind of help they should given to them for proper progress. It is of vital for planning purpose that what part of life is in backward from and how can it be improved.

OBJECTIVE

The present study aims to carry out the following objectives:-

1. To find out the socio-economic structure of the population.
2. To study the level of education among different social group.
3. To study the gap in socio-economic conditions in the village in different social group.

STUDY AREA

Nirjan is located at 29.3358°N and 76.3717°E. It is on Jind-Panipat road at 6km mile stone from the Govt. College Jind. This village reside on the left side of Jind-Panipat road.

According to the census 2011 information, the location code or village code of Nirjan is 060131. The total geographical area of village is 774 hectares. The total population is 3617 people and number of houses are 697. Male population is 53.3% and female population is 46.7%.

According to our survey (2023), the total population is 3534 people and number of houses are 771. Male population is 53.6% and female population is 47.3%. Village literacy rate is 63.3%. The nearby villages of Nirjan are Bishanpura, Radhana, Brah khurd, Lakhmir Wala, khokhri, Mando kheri, Barsana, manohar Pur.

HYPOTHESIS

1. Jaat is the main caste of the village.
2. Literacy rate and sex ratio should be high due to being close to the urban area.
3. The number of joint families should be higher than nucleated families.
4. The living standard is expected to vary with variation in social status.
5. Agriculture is the occupation of the village.

DATA SOURCE

This study is based on primary data. Primary data has been collected through a structured schedule which comprise all the questions necessary to understand the social and economic status of a household.

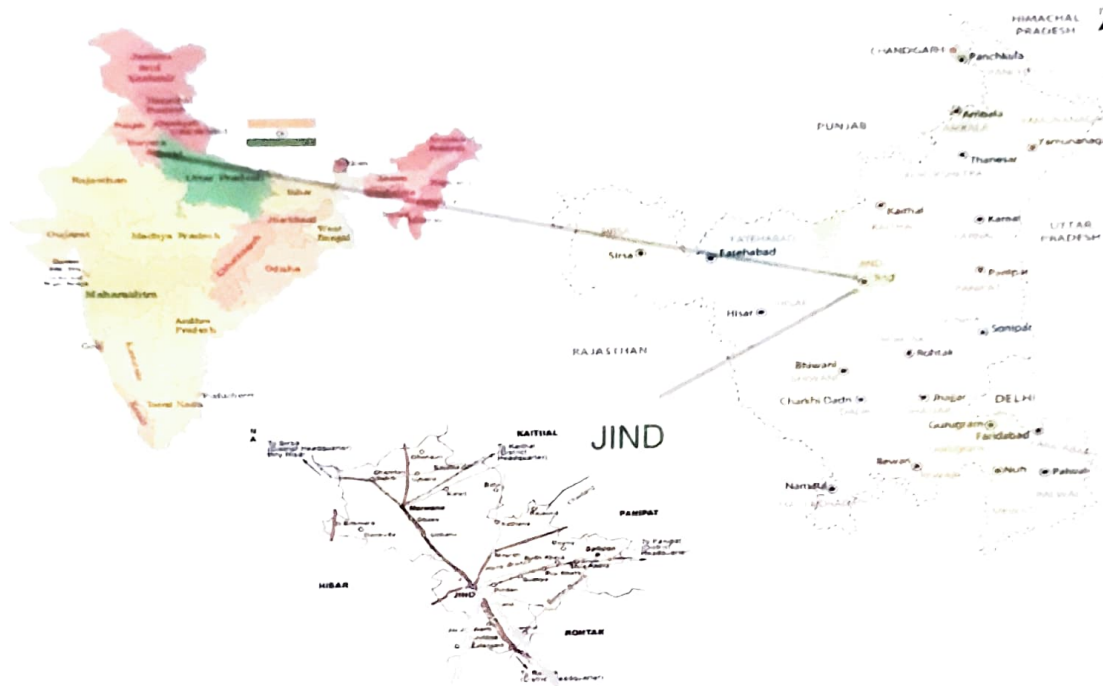
METHODOLOGY

In the process of collection of data, a census survey was conducted in the study area from 3 April 2023 to collect the data of all 771 households in the village.

For the purpose, the interview method was adopted where the students made interaction with the head and other family members of each and every household to fill all the details mentioned in the schedule.

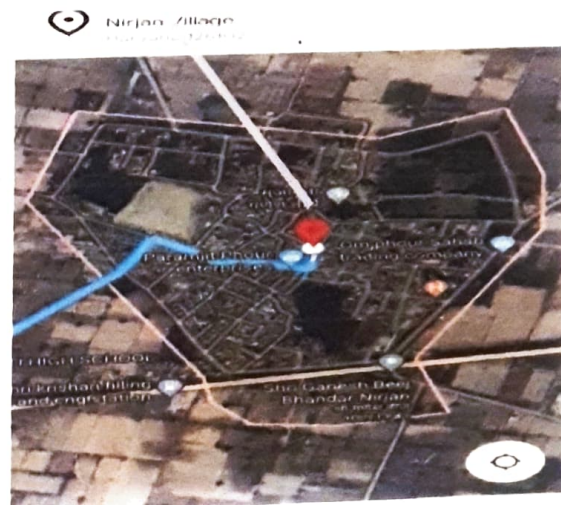

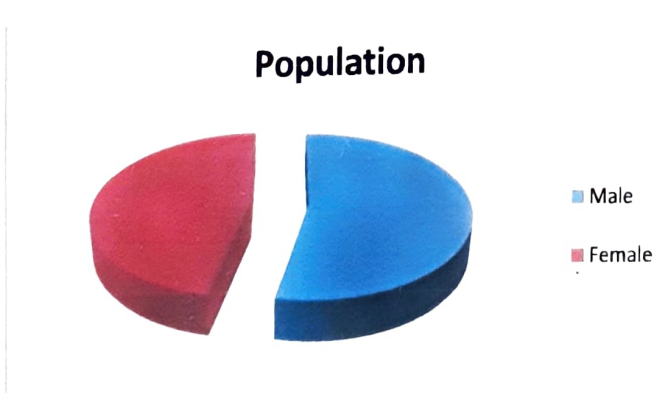

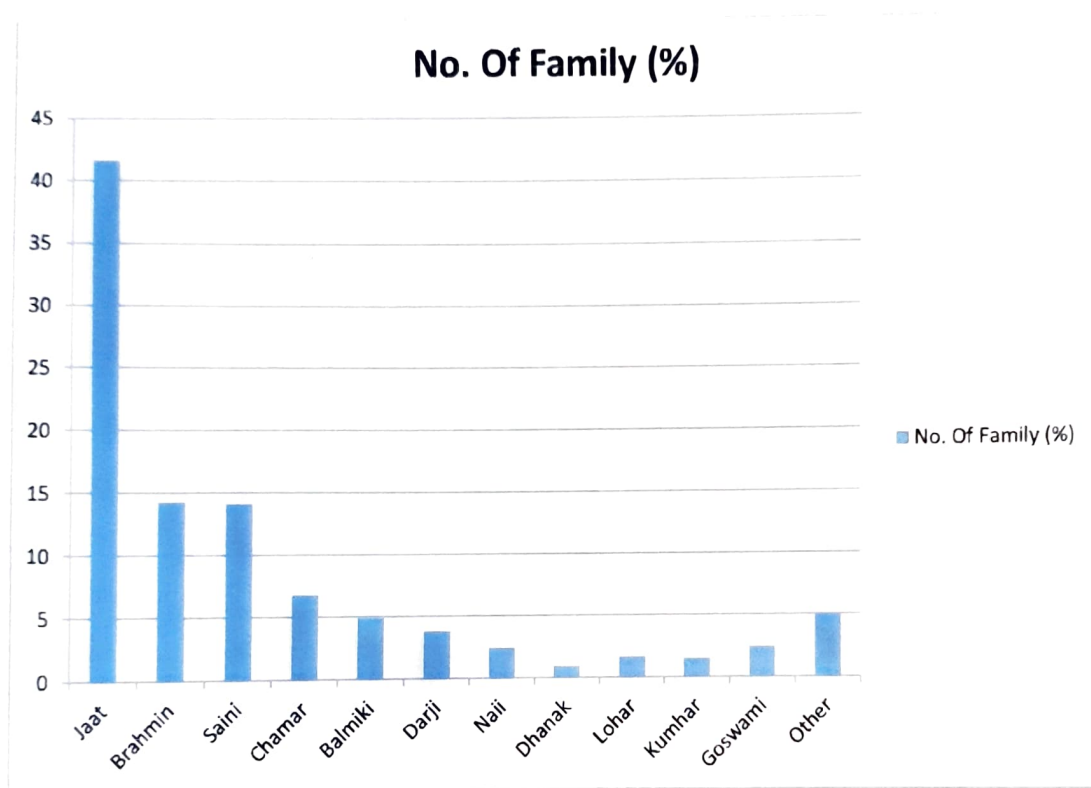
CASTE WISE DISTRIBUTION OF POPULATION

FAMILY TYPE

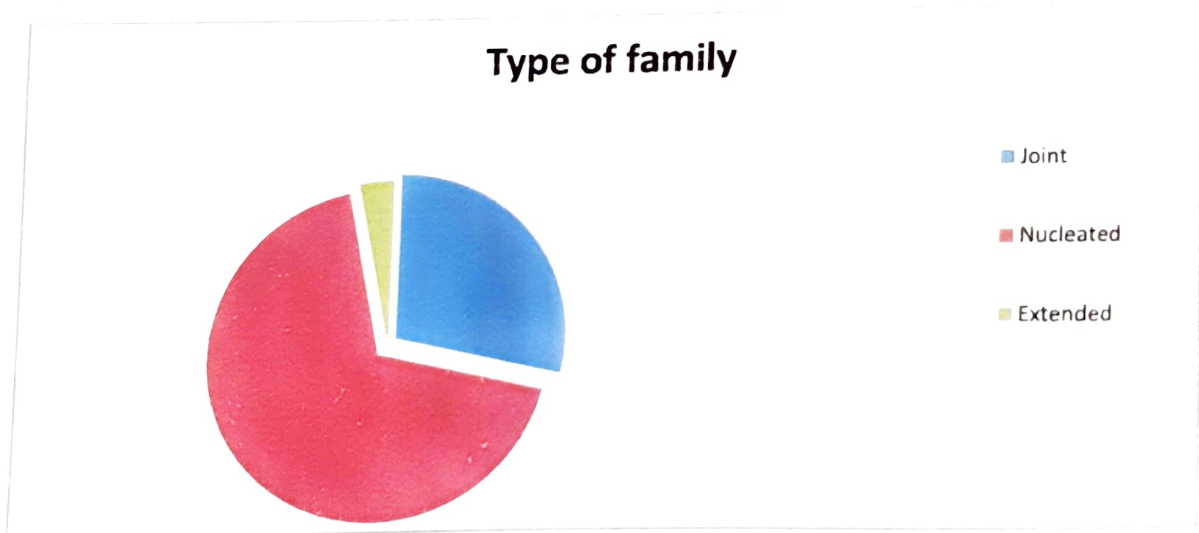

literate. According to table no. 5 literacy rate of village is 77.2% which is below national and above state average i.e. 77.7% and 75.5% respectively.

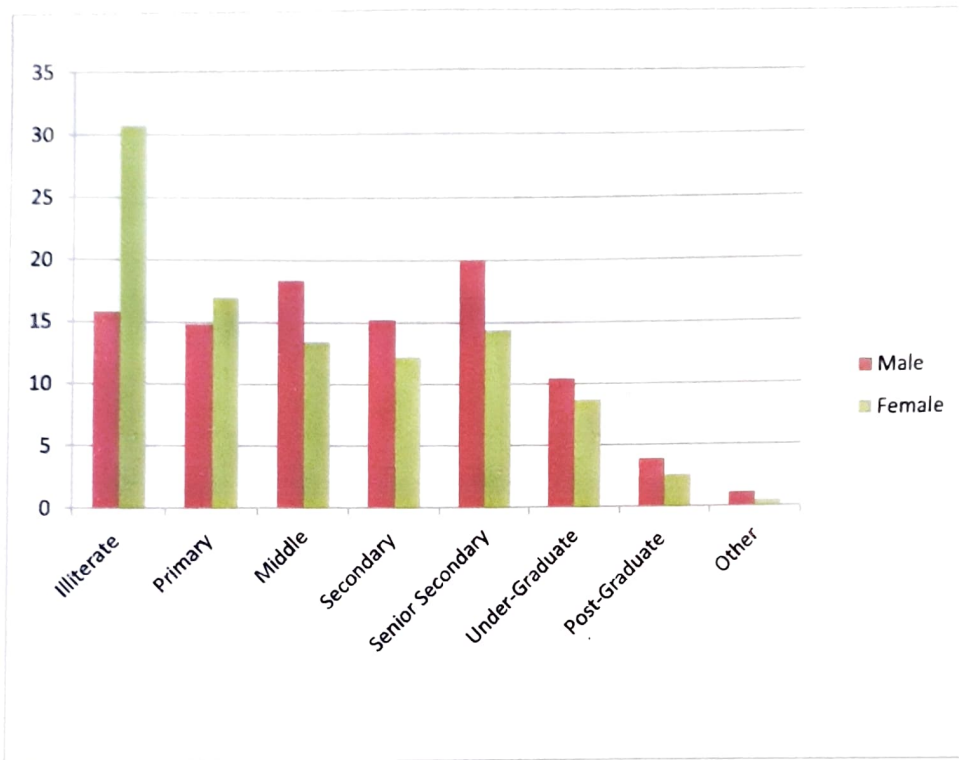

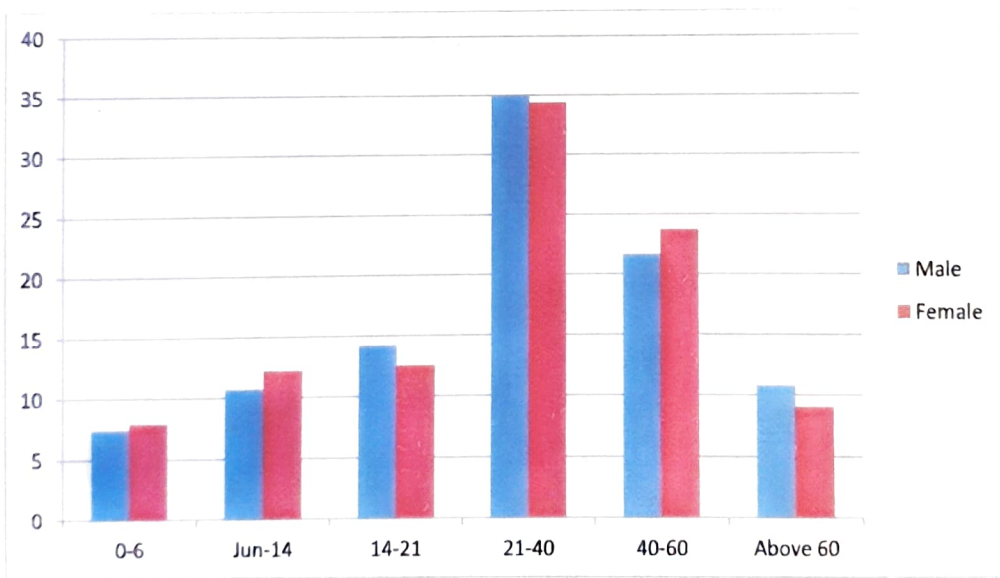
AGE GROUP

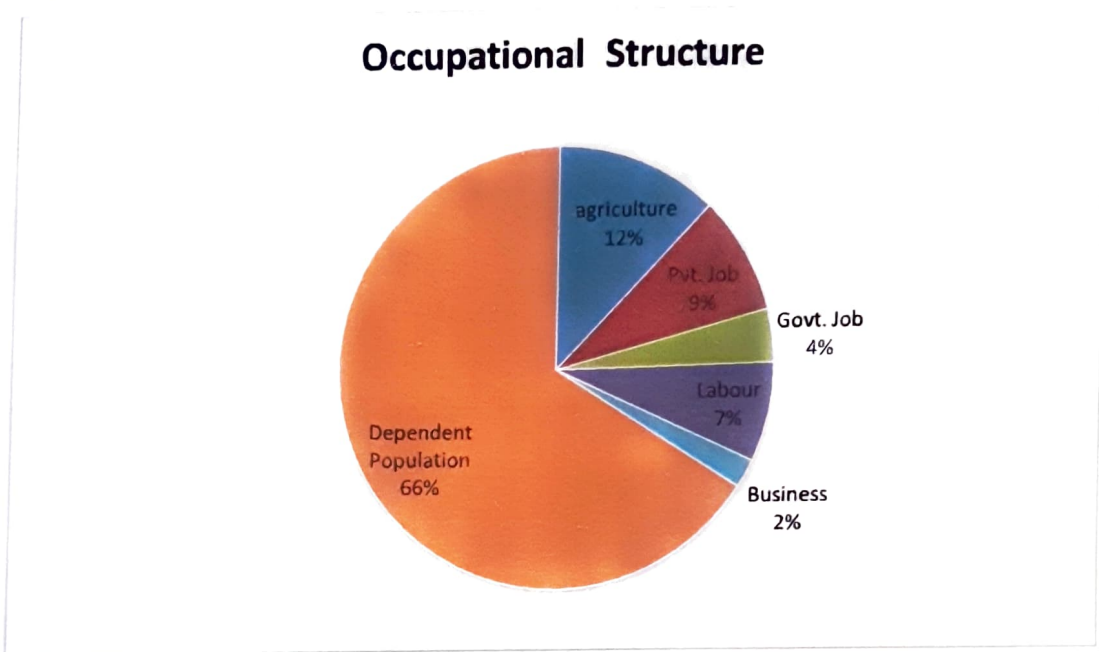
OCCUPATION

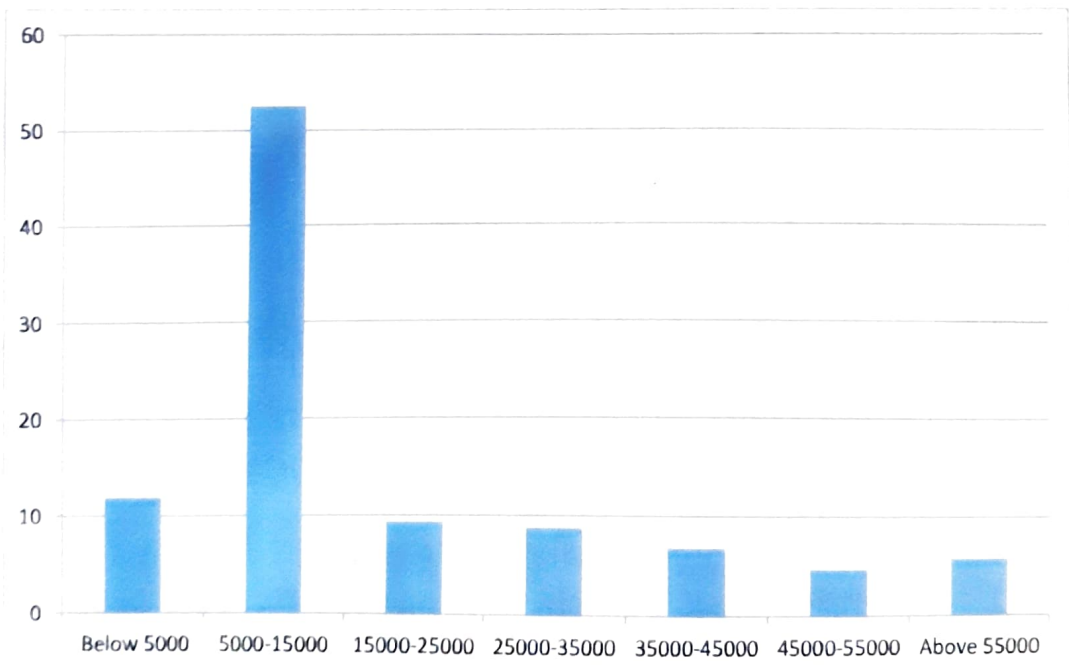
INCOME

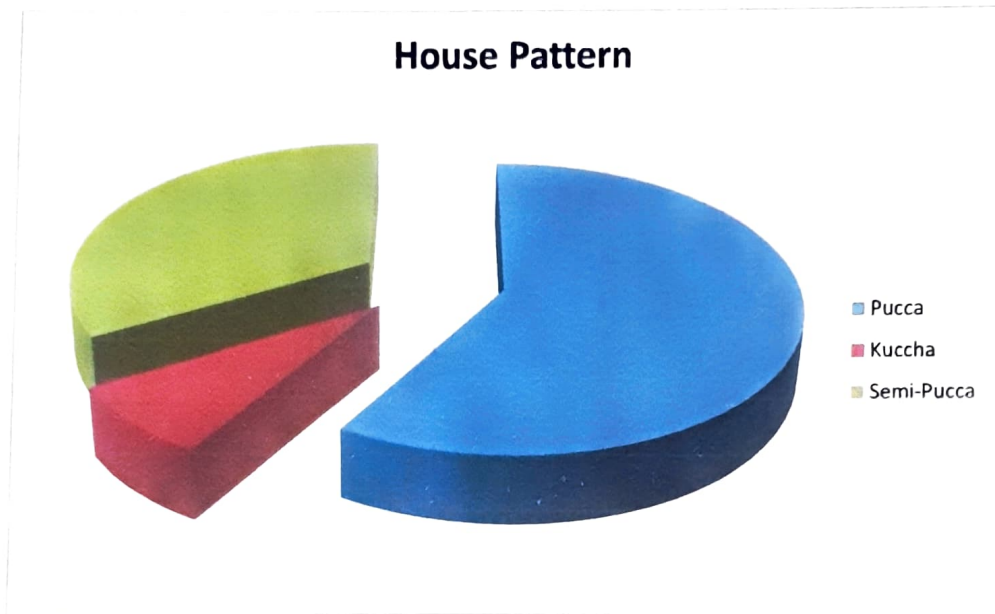

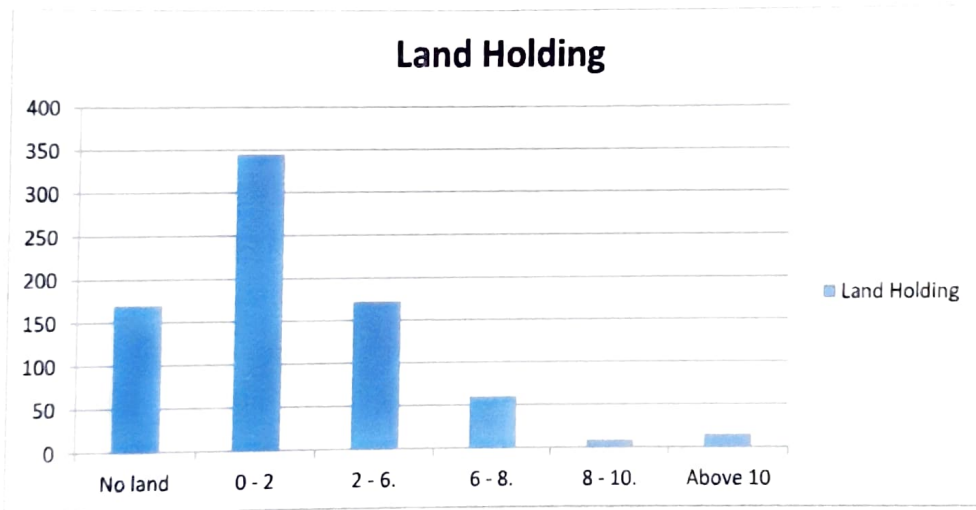
LAND-HOLDING SIZE

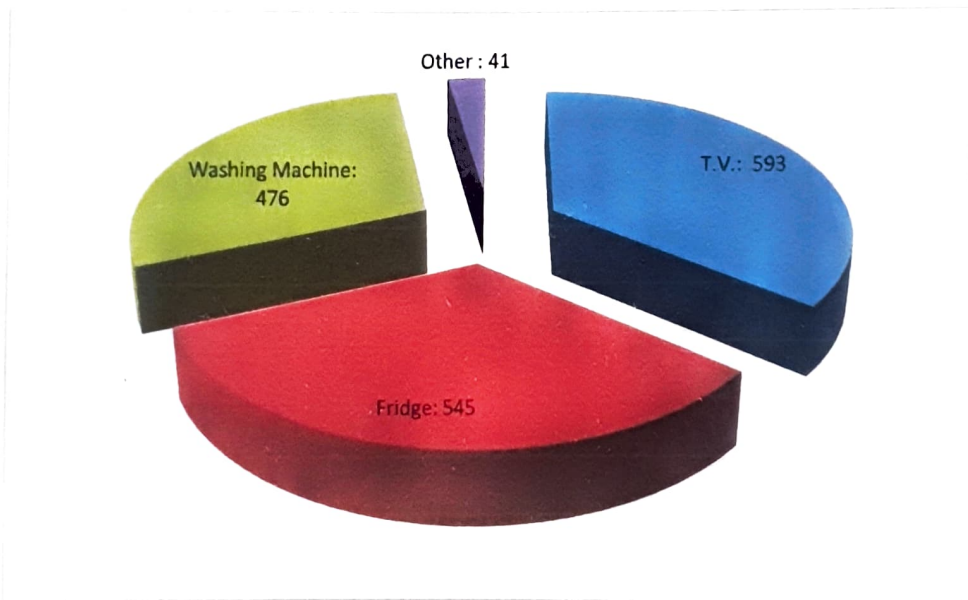
OTHER ASSET

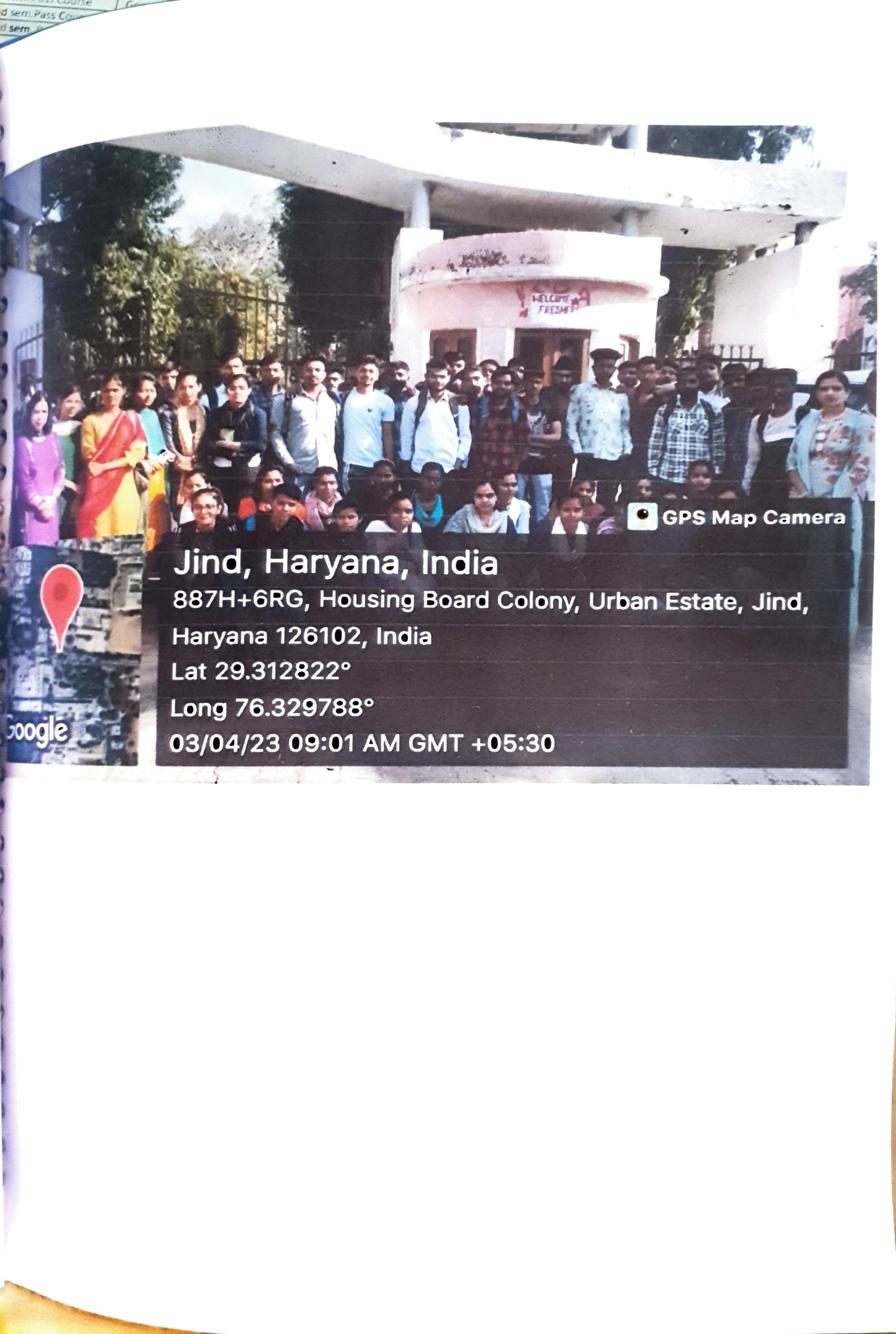
SUGGESTION:
